RE: Notification of Approval for FBI Level of Service

Dear Brenda Barnett:

This correspondence is to notify you that, pursuant to California Penal Code (PC) section 11105, your application to receive federal criminal offender record information (CORI) has been approved by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

Your agency is mandated to receive FBI level CORI for the following applicant type/s:

- Employee 11105.3 PC 92080

Authorized agencies are required to provide written notification to the applicants that will be fingerprinted that their fingerprints will be used for a FBI criminal history background check. The officials making the determination of suitability for licensing or employment shall provide the applicants the opportunity to complete, or challenge the accuracy of their FBI identification record. Officials must also advise the applicants that procedures for challenging or updating a FBI identification record are located in Title 28, C.F.R., §16.34.

Title 28, C.F.R., §16.34 states: "If, after reviewing his/her identification record, the applicant believes that it is incorrect or incomplete in any respect and wishes to change, correct, or update the alleged deficiency, he/she should contact the agency which contributed the questioned information. The applicant may also direct his/her challenge to the FBI. The FBI will then forward the challenge to the agency which submitted the data requesting that agency to verify or correct the challenged entry. Upon receipt of an official communication directly from the agency which contributed the original information, the FBI will make any changes necessary in accordance with the information supplied by that agency."

Officials making such determinations of suitability for licensing or employment should not deny the license or employment based on information in the record until the applicant has been afforded a reasonable time to correct or complete the record, or has declined to do so.
